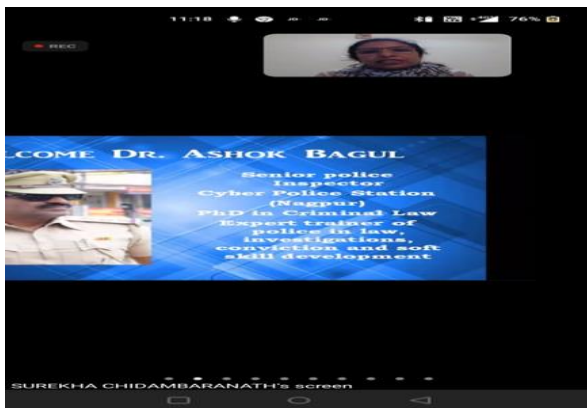




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**WEBINAR ON CYBER-CRIME AGAINST CHILDREN AND WOMEN-2021**

Dr. Ashok Bagul (senior Police Inspector) from Nagpur with a Phd in Criminal Law, Expert trainer of police in law, investigations, conviction and soft skill development and has also done an M.BA and LLM was our speaker. He also spoke about the types of cybercrime i.e. digital banking frauds, virus attacks on personal computers, social media related attacks etc. While he discussed, he kept interacting with the audience, asking them to ask and answer a few questions. He also spoke about romance fraud and how boys or girls blackmail each other etc. Dr. Bangul shared details about a recent cybercrime that he came across and explained to us what happened in that case.



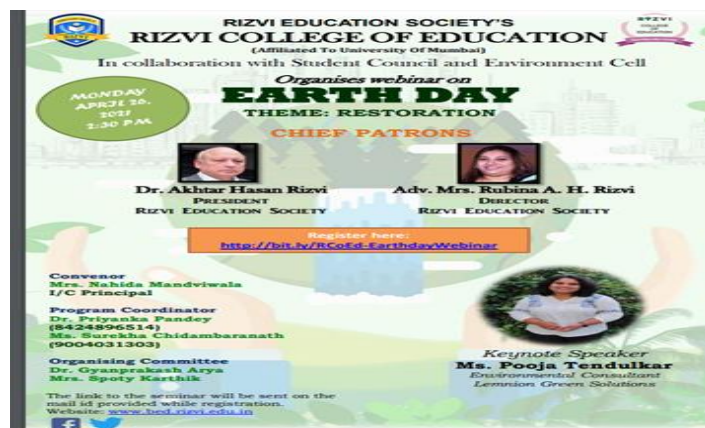
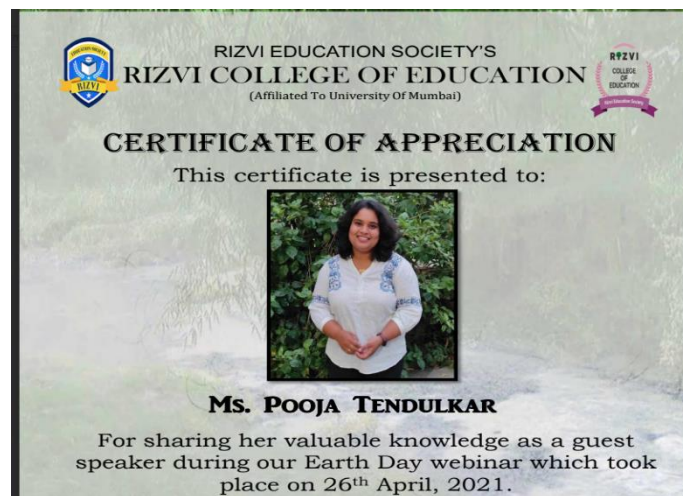




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## **EARTH DAY WEBINAR REPORT 2020-21**
