
Rizvi College of Education "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav: Har Ghar Tiranga Pakhwara" August 2022

Our Hon. Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi flagged off the 'Padyatra' on 12th March 2021 (Freedom March) from Sabarmati Ashram, Ahmedabad and inaugurated the curtain raiser activities of the 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' which will continue till 15th August, 2023. The Prime Minister emphasised the five pillars of "Amrit Mahotsav' i.e. Freedom Struggle, Ideas at 75, Achievements at 75, Actions at 75 and Resolves at 75 as the guiding force for moving forward, keeping our dreams and duties as inspiration. The Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav meaning 'Elixir of Energy of Independence'

encompasses the elixir of inspirations of the warriors of freedom struggle; the elixir of new ideas and pledges and the nectar of Aatmnirbharta.

This year **Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav 2022, l**aunched **'Har Ghar Tiranga'** campaign encouraging people to bring the Tiranga home and to hoist and display it marking the 75th year of India's Independence. Our relationship with the flag has always been more formal and institutional than personal. Bringing the flag home collectively as a nation in the 76th year of Independence becomes symbolic if not only an act of personal connection to the **Tiranga** but also an embodiment of our commitment to nation-building.

In tune with the UGC guidelines, Rizvi College of Education has organized various programs observing



the 76th Independence Day, from **8th August to 15th August 2022. This week long celebration** titled "**Har Ghar Tiranga** –**Pakhwara**" is an initiative to invoke the feeling of patriotism in the hearts of student-teachers, the future nation builders and to promote awareness about the **Indian National Flag**.

The following activities were conducted-

Digital Poster Making Competition

The most prominent and prestigious event of the Independence Day celebrations of Rizvi College of Education was the Digital Poster Making Competition. The event by the title 'Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat: Unity in diversity of our Nation' was the 6th edition of Inter-college & Inter School Competition Series being organized by the college for the last 6 years as part of Independence Day celebration. The Competition received tremendous response with students from 32 schools and 18 colleges from all of Maharashtra registering and taking part in it. The posters through its varied depictions tried to show case the culture, traditions and practices of different states & UTs. The visuals conveyed significant messages that will lead to an enhanced understanding and bonding between the states, thereby strengthening the unity and integrity of India in creative ways. The poster entries were judged by a panel on the criteria of creativity, design, originality, relevance and slogan. Two winners each were selected at the school and college levels. The winners at the school level were Miss Rinkel Ravariya (First Place) Std VII, Purushottam High School, Bandra, Mumbai; and Master Alpesh Bhojaya (Second Place) Std VII, Vakola English School, Santacruz, Mumbai. The winners at the college level were Mr. Sayed Mohammed Haider, (First Place) Pillai's College of Education, Chembur, Mumbai and Ms. Samreen Hasan Patel (Second Place) Rizvi College of education, Khar, Mumbai. Winners were felicitated with trophy & certificate on the Independence Day. Certificate was given to all the participant as encouragement and appreciation of their efforts.
