

Through the course of the workshop, Students were thought to make a Human Heart, Harrapan coins, Mandala Art, Bottle Art Design and also Warli painting were asked to roughly try on "Old T-Shirts, Scarfs, Pillow Covers, Tie and Dye etc. During the course of the workshop Experts also elaborated that how these items played a vital role during the olden days. They also explained us that how mostly made of silver, these bear symbols, each of which was punched on the coin with a separate punch. Issued initially by merchant Guilds and later by States, the coins represented a trade currency belonging to a period of intensive trade activity and urban development.





Significance of Warli Art. It is stated the Warli women used to paint their walls during the marriage to reflect on happiness and celebrations. Warli wall paintings are considered to be auspicious.
