Malgudi Reimagined: 3D Narratives & Critical Reflections

Report on R. K. Narayan Literary Event

The Language Club of Rizvi College of Education organized a literary event titled “**Malgudi Reimagined: 3D Narratives & Critical Reflections**” on the birth anniversary of R. K. Narayan. The programme witnessed active participation from English Pedagogy student-teachers, with FY and SY student-teachers, faculty members, and Language Club members forming the audience. The event aimed to celebrate R. K. Narayan’s contribution to Indian English literature by integrating literary analysis, creativity, and technology as part of the English Pedagogy curriculum.

A key academic component of the programme was the **critical review of research papers** based on R. K. Narayan’s works. Students analysed themes, narrative style, characterization, humour, and realism, which enhanced their critical thinking and literary appreciation. Alongside this, students presented **3D book model videos**, creatively depicting scenes and ideas from Narayan’s texts using digital tools. The videos were uploaded on YouTube on 10th October 2025 in honour of the author’s birth anniversary.

The presentations were **evaluated by Mrs. Maria Shaikh**, Professor of English Literature, through an online Google Form assessment. Based on content quality, analysis, creativity, and presentation, the group presenting *A Horse and the Two Goats* was declared the winner. Certificates were awarded to the winning team, and all participants were appreciated for their efforts.

Additional activities included a **virtual R. K. Narayan Museum**, a **Library Corner** displaying his works, an **eco-friendly book donation initiative**, and the **inauguration of multilingual grammar flip books** prepared by student-teache
